### Keynote Speaker



Our keynote speaker will be Professor Mark Brett, Whitley College, Melbourne, who will be speaking on the “Past and

future of Biblical Studies in Australia.” Professor Mark Brett teaches Hebrew Bible and ethics at Whitley College in Melbourne, within the University of Divinity. His research has focused on the book of Genesis, ethnicity, and postcolonial studies in the Australian context. He is the author of *Genesis: Procreation and the Politics of Identity* (2000), *Decolonizing God: The Bible in the Tides of Empire* (2008), and *Political Trauma and Healing: Biblical Ethics for a Postcolonial World* (2016) among many other works.
